The Distance You Cover

I am in the meadow where I meet with my animals standing by the Pine Tree that is my creature of imagery. It is winter and the meadow is bare. The Pine Tree stands there strong and I ask if it is my guide for this journey. The Tree's needles shake as if it is chuckling and it says, "The only place that I can guide you is to the top of me." So, I start to climb. It is easy to climb, like a ladder. The branches are just the right distance apart so that I climb easily inside them right by the trunk to the top of the tree. The tree is so strong from the base to the top. It doesn't get wobbly at all. Tree says to me, "You're like that, too." I look out through the pine needles at this amazing view, beautiful winter, all greys and browns. I can see so far. I ask tree what I am supposed to be seeing. It says, "Just look." In every direction it goes on and one until the scene fades out of view. I know it continues on, but I just can't see it any longer. Tree shows me the view and relates it to the family reunion that we are planning – shows me where the view starts out strong and then ends up in a box canyon and equates that to those brothers and sisters of my father some of whom died in infancy, others who had no children. Tree points to other areas of the vast scene that seem to go on and on and says that is like the family members who had many children.

Tree shows me an area that it says represents my immediate family, showing me that whatever happens with me, this view continues in essential ways over paths of the scene of which I have no comprehension. It is a glorious view in all directions with mountains and woods, valleys, rivers, every possible manifestation of life in all directions and we are a part of it; not creating it, not separate from it, but an aware part. Sometimes we think we are creating it, but we aren't.

I ask if there is anything I need to do with this and Pine Tree says, "Isn't it enough to just see it and be with it? Take time to be with it."

My bear (feeling) and turtle (grounding) and mountain lion (emotion) come to join me in the Pine Tree and at once the Tree is filled with my family. My grandchildren are playing with Bear and it is such a joyous scene. The spirit of my daughter Cindy is here just being with every member of my family. I thank her for always being with us. She tells me that it doesn't matter what happens to me, whether I remain here or go to be with her. My spirit will be with my family always, too. She says, "Nothing is ever lost. It is a vast tapestry. We each are just a thread, an essential thread. Your role and the role of each of us is to be the strongest best thread we can be for the time that we are here, not to worry how many others we touch. We are each one on our path. There is no way to judge and no reason to judge someone else's path. We just need to live the best we can."

I become aware that I can recognize myself and each of my brothers and sisters and parents and children and friends in the tapestry that is the scene extending outward forever around the Pine Tree. Each of us is a brilliant stitch surrounded by a unique tapestry flower, some tiny, some spreading out endlessly and unknowably interwoven with other flowers, but each perfect. And I realize that the tapestry is continually being woven as I watch. It is so beautiful to see the tapestry being woven.

I finally climb down the tree and when I get to the bottom it is Spring. Everything is in bloom. Lots of blue Iris in the meadow. It is so lovely. I thank the Tree for always being there and for such a beautiful journey. Tree says, "The distance you cover is not important. It is the quality and the beauty of your journey that is important."

UNESCO

Andrea Campbell, was elected as a permanent member of the UNESCO Leadership Committee in Istanbul at the conference in 2003. She will attend the conference June 24-27, 2004 in Istanbul and present a paper.

Tews from IIVR

At the annual board meeting in October 2003 the Council of Elders set out to address both the successes and failures of IIVR. The meeting began with a ceremony in which the Elders released all that IIVR had been; all our expectations for IIVR and all our frustrations. This process allowed the Council to restructure IIVR so that the important work of IIVR can be carried out more efficiently.

The Council moved to close the office and reserve those funds for other functions. To do this effectively it was decided that IIVR would need a volunteer coordinator, Debra Vickroy, to be a focal point for communication among the Council and the community. Each Council member would also be asked to take on responsibility for some aspect of IIVR.

Financial management will be handled by Rhonda Lunsford with the support of Kris Olson, IIVR Treasurer until a volunteer administrator and new Council Treasurer are identified.

ccomplishments:

Although IIVR has experienced two difficult years, it has been able to provide support to the Personal Totem Pole Process community through the giving of scholarships, and through Practitioner and Festival support.

IIVR has continuously sponsored scholarships for trainees who will bring deep imagery into professional settings. Over the last six years, IIVR has provided over 25 scholarships to trainees worldwide.

IIVR has sponsored a U. S. Practitioners Council. Its purpose is to help certified PTPP practitioners and trainees in their third year of training to support each other in the development of a practice of deep imagery work (in whatever area or manner that suits each practitioner).

IIVR has also continued to support an annual Festival of the Animals by providing practical support and often, financial support. In 2002, the Festival was in Australia. This provided a focal point for the emerging Australian community to introduce new people to deep imagery and to further the work that Frank Coughlan has been doing for several years. It also lead to a decision by the Australian community to hold a local Festival in 2003.

In 2003, the Festival of the Animals was held in Northern California. Although small in numbers, it has provided a catalyst for an evolving California community.

Both new participants and veteran journeyers did some profound imagery work.

Notice Forward: Website -Of major concern is the promotion of, networking in and communication for the PTPP. To address this issue, the Council agreed to the development of a new website designed by Mary Diggin. It was also agreed that the new web address would be www.deepimagery.org. Mary proposed that IIVR contract with Yahoo Small Business as the server. She proposed the new website include the following:

- The focus will be to capture the spirit of the work
- there will be a section that describes deep imagery and the PTPP
- the website will promote the work through testimonials, samples of journeys and biographies of the practitioners (who, as Mary pointed out, are very intriguing and interesting people)
- there will be a products/donation section with security for accepting credit cards
- there will be a page for each country to announce and describe their work
- there will be a section devoted to scholarships with the applications and requirements available to download with information as to where to send the completed application
- there will be a sponsorship page for making direct donations
- there can be secure chat rooms for the use of Council of Elders, Doorway Council and Practitioners
- the site through Yahoo comes with 25 e-mail boxes with an@deepimagery.org; addresses that can be used by the active coordinators or auctioned for donations
- the site will be home for the eTotempole Pole
- maintenance costs will be minimal with updates happening every six to twelve months

Tundraising

Another major area of IIVR's focus needs to be fundraising. To facilitate this, Rosalie Douglas agreed to chair a Products Committee. Rosalie's vision is to offer tasteful imagery-related items for sale on the new website with the proceeds going to fund IIVR. The first item may be a new T-shirt offered for a donation of around \$20 to \$25. Rosalie will coordinate the things that will be offered on the website as well as the distribution of the items. She has developed a committee including Pam McWethy and Laura Lindsay. They will be soliciting items to be donated for sale to support IIVR.

The website page that announces and describes each country's work will provide US and non-US practitioners with concrete identification with IIVR that should encourage their financial support. The website sponsorship page will provide a simple method for that support.

C cholarships -

The Scholarship Committee will be chaired by Gail Perkin and include Karen Rider and Janet Francis. Making the scholarship applications available on-line will streamline the process for candidates. Completed applications will be sent to Gail for distribution to Karen and Janet. IIVR is currently seeking funding for scholarships.

Pestivals - A Standing Festival Committee will be chaired by Phee Brooks and include Audrey Dickson, Frank Coughlan, and members of the community who are willing to support the organizing committee of each Festival. IIVR will also contribute financial support as long as it has funds in the Festival account.

About This Area:

D iver Spirit

KThis is a photo of the house. As you look at it, the room on the left is the original house, built from adobe over 100 years ago. The rest of the house was added on room by room and is constructed from such various items as railway sleepers, wood paneling and ordinary brick. It is all fi nished in adobe style stucco.

The window frames are painted blue, a traditional Hispanic custom that originated with the Moors as a means of warding off the Evil Eye.

Taos Pueblo

This is Taos Pueblo, the oldest continuosly occupied Pueblo in the USA. It is about

3/4 of an hours drive from River Spirit. Pueblo is the Spanish word for town and was given as a nameby the Conquistadores to the Native American Villages they saw inNM. These villages were built out of Adobe, brick made of mud, straw and other debris. Some people think that the legendary Cities of Gold the Spanish saw, were an illusion caused by sunlight refl ecting off the straw in the adobe, in the Pueblos walls. Taos Pueblo dates from 1300 AD. In European terms, that is not very old but in the USA it is regarded as quite ancient. There are older ruins nearby, in Chaco canyon, Bandelier, Mesa Verde, etc., built as cliff

dwellings, dating from 800ad





River Spirit is right on the Rio Grande, yes, the one ABBA sang about!. The trees that surround the house are cottonwoods. They turn a golden yellow in autumn. This photo was taken from the door of the house, and shows the an easterly view of the river, with the golden cottonwoods.

Forth Coming Workshops

Sept 20-26 **Creativity and Clay,** River Spirit, NM USA Creativity and Clay begins on Sept 20th 2004, You will need to arrive by early afternoon at River Spirit. The workshop ends at noon on the 26th. There will be a sweat lodge at Felipe Ortega's House on the evening of the 25th.

With Steve Gallegos:

After breakfast each day we will journey to various aspects of creativity: the animal of creativity, any blocks to creativity, whatever might need to heal in our creativity, the energies of creativity, the animal of the pot we will make (or are making), the animal of the clay and what it needs from us, etc. It is likely that creativity in most of us has been somewhat stunted because of the way we have been engineered to be similar to one another, in our schools and in our cultures. So to be different, which creativity is, means being willing to stand forth as who we are without excuses or rationalizations, the way a flower stands forth and lets itself be seen. The journeying will be either in the large group of in dyads or triads, depending on the composition of the group.

With Felipe Ortega:

After lunch we will drive (about an hour) to Felipe Ortega's house and studio in La Madera, a small and traditional New Mexico community, and spend the afternoon being taught by Felipe. Felipe Ortega is an Apache Medicine Man and a famous potter who works only in micaceous clay. The pots he makes are lovely, balanced and have a beautiful form. They are also pots that can be used for cooking. As you are making pots he helps you learn about yourself from the way you build and handle the pot. It is as if the vessel that you are is mirrored in the vessel that you bring forth out of earth. The workshop will include a traditional Apache sweat lodge at his home on the evening of Sept. 25th, just before a full moon. There are also nearby Indian villages and interesting towns that people occasionally want to have time off to visit.

We can sleep and have breakfast and lunch at River Spirit (Steve's home) on the Rio Grande River. The accommodations include two geodesic domes, a stone building, an adobe room and any large tents that we need, all supplied with beds or futons. You could bring a towel and a sleeping bag, but we also have some here. Alternatively, we can send a list of nearby B&B's, which one can book independently. The cost of B&B's is not included in the workshop fee. We do not charge for sleeping at River Spirit. River Spirit also has a hot tub, which you are welcome to use during your stay.

The workshop will end with lunch on Sept. 26th. The cost, including lunch and lodging at River Spirit, is \$700.00 per person. Evening meals will need to be arranged separately. People may like to eat at Felipe's, at a cost of \$10 per meal or may wish to try local restaurants in Espanola or other nearby towns. The maximum number of attendees is 10. **email:workshops@moonbearpress.com**
